

MARINE BASIC FIRST AID

A comprehensive two-day course designed to meet the needs of those expected to provide first aid in a marine environment, specifically tailored to the marine/fishing industry or recreational boaters. This course uses a combination of lecture, discussion, and scenarios to teach the required knowledge and skills.

As an approved Canadian Red Cross training partner, WHSC's course on marine basic first aid prepares individuals for unique situations that may arise while in or on the water, while providing the necessary confidence and skills to perform first aid. This course meets the requirements for Transport Canada outlined by Transport Publication (TP) 13008 E and includes the latest CPR guidelines and training in the use of an AED.
